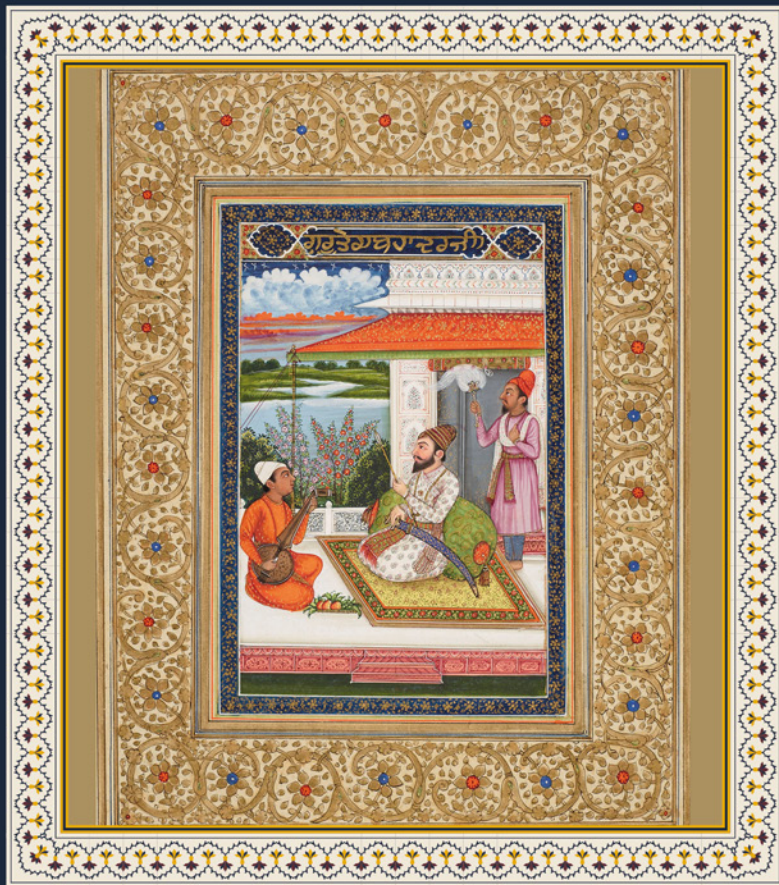

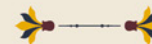

The relics of Guru Sahib

The revered possessions of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji are preserved in Gurdwara Sahibs related to Guru Ji's life. These include Guru Ji's Tulwar (housed at Moti Bagh, Patiala), Karra (iron bangle housed at Guru Ka Bagh, Patna Sahib) and Kharraavan (sandalwood slippers housed at Takhat Sri Harmandir Ji, Patna Sahib). Many more relics are preserved in Gurdwara Sahibs across India, including the handwritten Hukamnamas (edicts) of Guru Sahib.

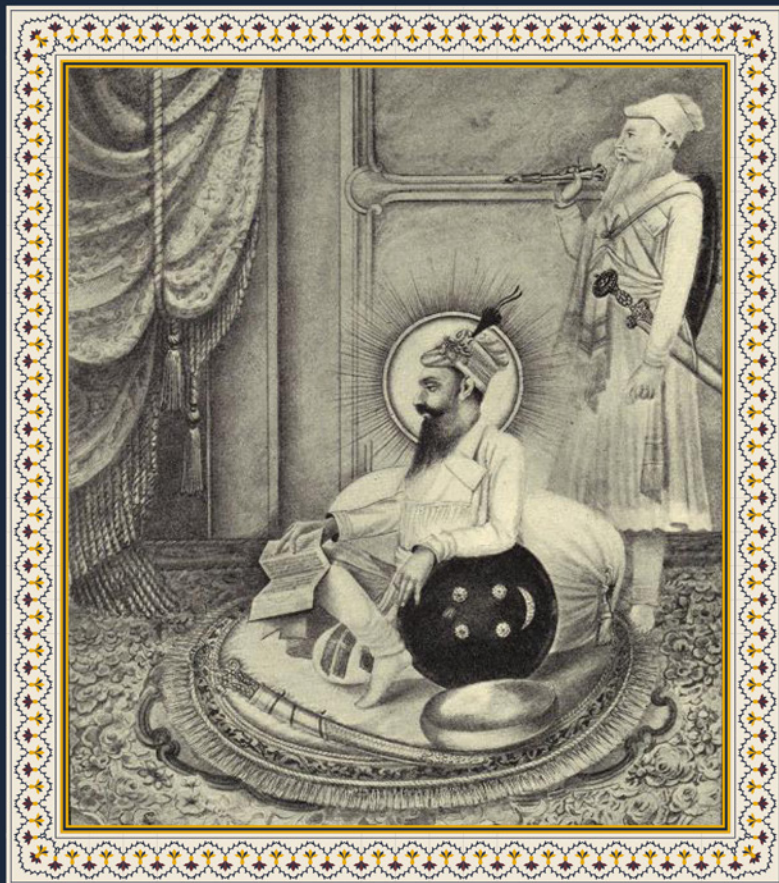

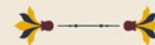

The creation of Sri Anandpur Sahib

Guru Ji laid the foundation of a new spiritual and temporal centre for the Sikhs at Makhwal, on land offered by the royal family of Bilaspur. Formerly known as Makhwal, Guru Ji named this city as 'Chakk Nanaki'. All ministers, disciples and traders were given land and enough money to construct homes. Land for tilling was given free to farmers who came to settle there. These farmers contributed towards the upkeep of the town by giving a portion (daswandh) of what they produced towards the Langar, which fed countless of destitute people regardless of their background or social status. Later on, this city was renamed as 'Anandpur Sahib' – the city of bliss.

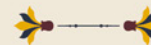

The travels of Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji

When the Sikhs of East India arrived for Guru Ji's Darshan in Panjab, they supplicated for Guru Ji to visit East India as none of the Guru Sahibs after Guru Nanak Dev Ji had been able to visit these places. Guru Ji accepted their request and visited many places such as Kurukshetra, Mathura, Benaras, Uttar Pardesh, Bihar, Assam, Bengal and Dhaka (present-day Bangladesh). Guru Ji further strengthened the love for Guru Nanak Dev Ji's path of Sikhi in these areas. Mata Gujri Ji, the Mehal of Guru Ji, remained with the Sikh Sangat of Patna Sahib whilst Guru Ji travelled further east towards the regions of Assam/Bangladesh. It was at Sri Patna Sahib in 1666 that Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji took Parkash.

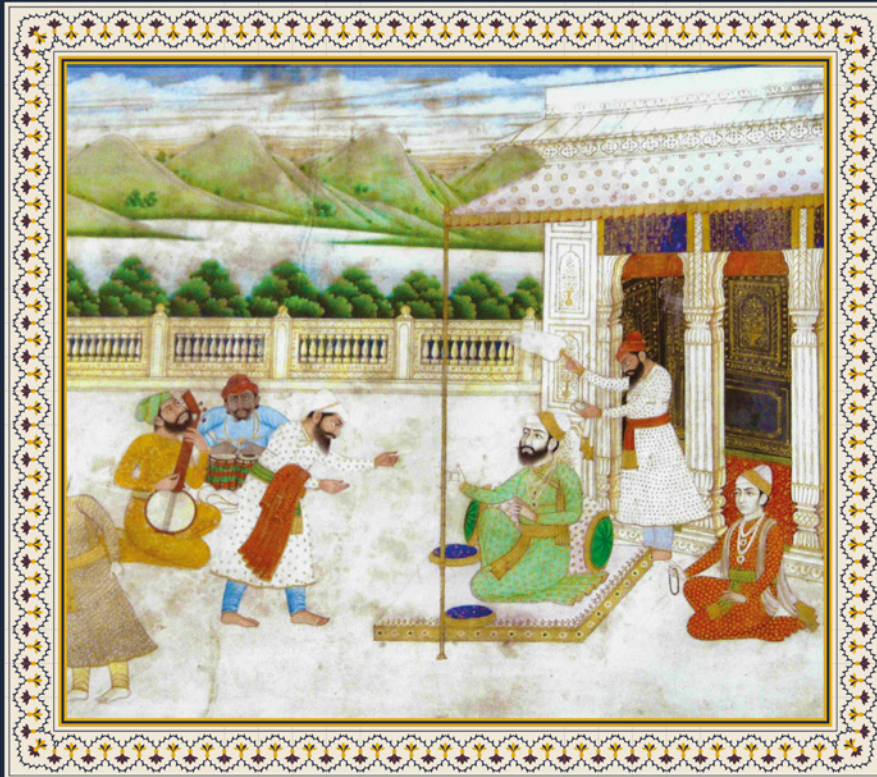
The Baani of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji

The Baani of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji spans 15 Raags in Sri Guru Granth Sahib Ji, comprised of 59 Shabads and 56 Saloks (according to historical sources, Guru Gobind Singh Ji wrote the 54th couplet of Salok Mahalla 9). Raag Jaijavanti (the last Raag of Sri Guru Granth Sahib Ji) solely contains the Shabads of Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji. Guru Ji's Baani is full of Vairaag (detachment from the material world) and instructs the spiritual seeker to make full use of this rare human birth to unite with Vaheguru. According to Sikh historical texts, Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji added the Baani of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji during the compilation of Sri Guru Granth Sahib Ji.

The plea of the Kashmiri Pandits

When Aurangzeb oppressed the Kashmiri Pandits, they came to the sanctuary of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji at Anandpur. Guru Ji prophesied, 'the sacrifice of a supreme soul is required'. The young Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji spoke saying, "O father! There is no one more supreme than you who can save the honour of the downtrodden". Pleased with these wise words, Guru Ji gave assurance to the Kashmiri Pandits and left to meet Aurangzeb in Delhi. Despite many meetings with Aurangzeb, the egotistical king refused to forsake his oppressive ways. Guru Ji was kept in the Kotwali (jail) of Chandni Chowk. It was here that Guru Ji sent Gurbani in the form of letters (Salok Mahalla 9) to reassure the Sikhs of Anandpur.

Gurtagaddi Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji

From Delhi, Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji sent Bhai Gurditta Ji (a descendant of Baba Budha Ji) with the regalia to anoint Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji as the next Guru. Bhai Gurditta Ji entrusted the responsibility of performing the Gurgadhi ceremony to his son, Bhai Raam Koer Ji, who was only three years old at the time. Guru Gobind Singh Ji writes about the Shaheedi of Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji in his autobiographical composition titled 'Bachittar Natak':

'Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji left for Sachkhand, breaking their earthly vase (i.e. their body) on the head of Aurangzeb. No one has ever done such a unique deed like the sacrifice of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji'.

The supreme sacrifice

After Guru Ji refused to perform miracles or convert to Islam, Aurangzeb ordered their execution. First, the faithful Sikhs of the Guru, Bhai Mati Das Ji, Bhai Sati Das Ji and Bhai Dayal Das Ji accepted Shaheedi, refusing to bow down to the oppression of the Mughal regime. When Aurangzeb asked the meaning of Guru Ji's name, Guru Sahib replied that he would find out at the time of the beheading. Guru Sahib was the master of the sword, the controller of birth and death, no sword could destroy Guru Sahib. In historical sources such as Sri Gurpartap Suraj Granth, it is written that Guru Sahib Ji's head left their body just before the sword of the executioner could touch Guru Sahib Ji's Pavithar Sees.

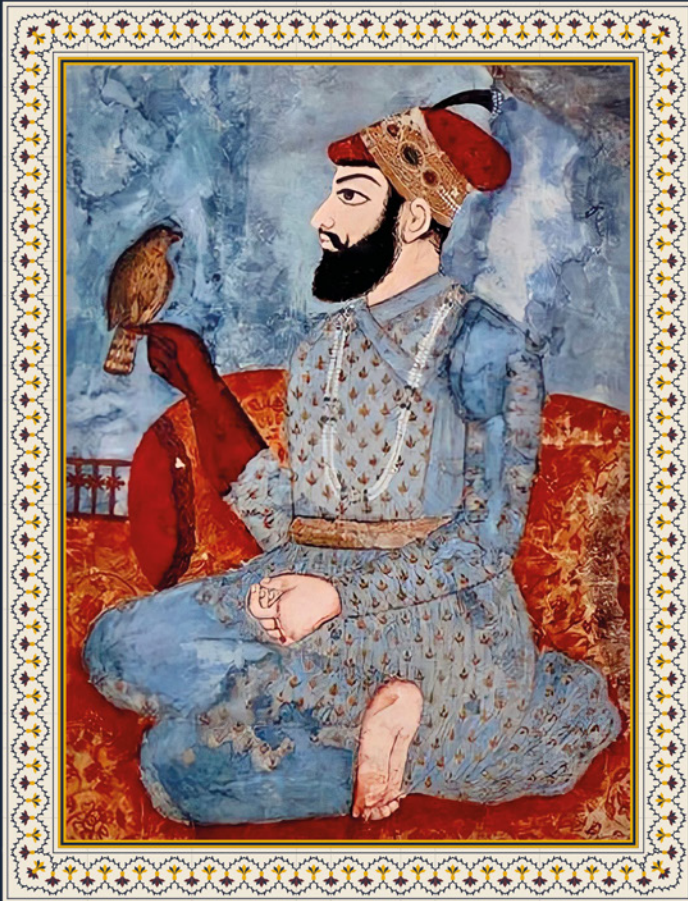
Sri Sees Ganj Sahib

Guru Ji gave Shaheedi on Maghar Sudi 5, 1732 Bikrami, after taking Ishnaan and reciting Sri Jap Ji Sahib. Gurdwara Sri Sees Ganj Sahib stands on the spot where Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Sahib Ji gave the ultimate sacrifice for the protection of Dharam (righteousness). The Sees of Guru Sahib was taken by Bhai Jaitha Ji to Sri Anandpur Sahib. Gurdwara Sri Sees Ganj Sahib (Anandpur) stands on the spot where Guru Ji's Sees was cremated. The brave Bhai Lakhi Shah Vanjara risked his life to retrieve Guru Ji's Sareer from Chandi Chowk. Placing Guru Ji's Sareer in his house, he set his home alight to avoid the detection of the Mughal forces. On this spot now stands Gurdwara Sri Rakab Ganj Sahib (Delhi).
