Sri Hazur Sahib (Nanded)



Takhat Sachkhand Sri Hazur Sahib Nanded

Takhat Sachkhand Sri Hazur Sahib is the blessed site of Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji's Sachkhand Gaman (ascension to Sachkhand) and the Gurgaddi of Sri Guru Granth Sahib Ji. The daily Maryada, the preservation and worship of historic Shastar, and the continuity of time-honoured practices create an atmosphere that is not merely commemorative but lived. For many in the sangat, Sri Hazur Sahib is one of the last strongholds where the remnants of traditional Khalsa discipline, reverence, and way of life have survived intact - allowing an unbroken connection to Guru Sahib Ji's presence. This calendar highlights the main historic Asthaans around Nanded, which hold an important place in the hearts of Sikhs across the globe.

Gurdwara Hira Ghaat Sahib

Gurdwara Hira Ghaat Sahib is situated on the bank of the Godavari River, around 6 miles from Sri Sachkhand Sahib. Here, Bahadur Shah offered a priceless diamond to Guru Sahib. To remove the emperor's pride, Guru Sahib threw the diamond into the river. When the emperor became anxious, Guru Sahib smiled and instructed him to look into the river; the emperor saw countless priceless diamonds lying there and overcome with shame, sought forgiveness from Guru Sahib.

Gurdwara Shikaar Ghaat Sahib

There was a resident of Sialkot named Moola Khatri, who was extremely devoted to Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji. Towards the end of his life, however, he turned away from Guru Ji. When Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji visited, Moola (at his wife's request) avoided Guru Ji and hid, fearing Guru Ji might take him on another long journey. Soon after, Moola died of snakebite. His wife, realising her folly, begged Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji for forgiveness. Guru Sahib said: "He was my Sikh, and I will surely liberate him, but in my tenth form." Later, at this place, during a hunt, Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji liberated Moola - who was then in the life-form of a hare (rabbit), thus fulfilling Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji's promise.

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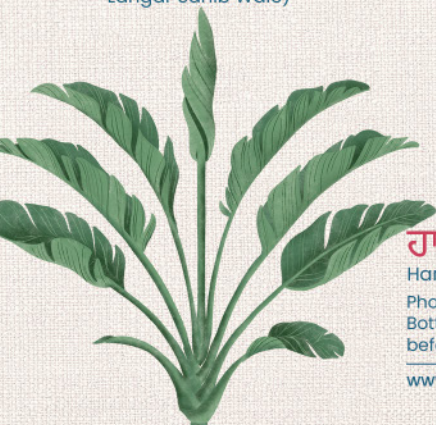

Gurdwara Mata Sahib Deva Ji

This Gurdwara Sahib is situated on the riverbank around 7 miles from Sri Sachkhand Sahib Ji. Mata Sahib Deva Ji established her camp here and would prepare langar for Guru Sahib. Mata Ji remained immersed in Naam and Bani. Before Guru Sahib's Sachkhand Gaman, she departed for Delhi in accordance with Guru Ji's command. Mata Ji did Benti that it was her discipline not to eat without Guru Ji's darshan; Guru Sahib gave Mata Ji his own Shastar, saying she would obtain Darshan through their worship. In 1922, Baba Mitt Singh Ji Nihung and Baba Dharam Singh Ji Nihung arrived here for Darshan. Through their intense tapasya and by Mata Ji's blessing, Langar continues here without interruption, and Nihung Singhs serve the sangat with great love.

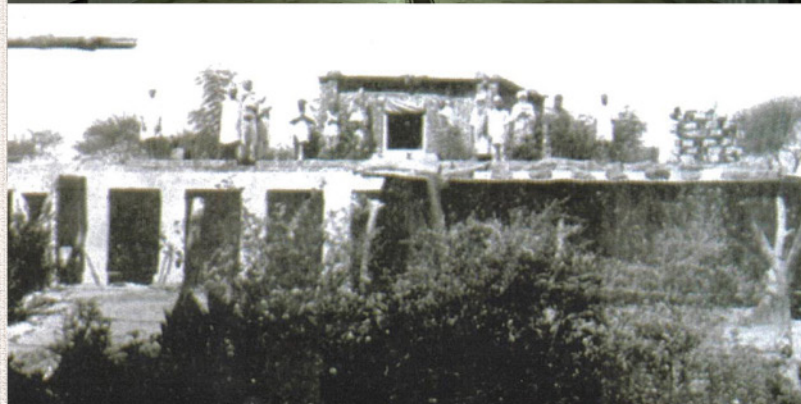

Gurdwara Sangat Sahib

Gurdwara Sangat Sahib Ji is situated on the bank of the Godavari in the Brahmpuri area of Nanded. When Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji came to Nanded from Gurdwara Hira Ghaat, Guru Ji first arrived and stayed at Sangat Sahib. The local sangat would gather and take bliss in Guru Ji's presence, uplifted through katha-vaarta (discourse). Some of the fauj (army) who had come from Punjab with Guru Ji asked for their wages. A large sum of money was excavated from Gurdwara Maal Tekri Sahib and distributed at Sangat Sahib among the Khalsa and royal armies using a dhaal (shield). This dhaal can still be seen at the Gurdwara Sahib.

Gurdwara Maal Tekri Sahib

Gurdwara Maal Tekri Sahib Ji is also said to have been known historically as "Chakri Maal" and "Maal Tilla". From here, Guru Sahib had hidden wealth (gupt maya) taken out and later distributed among the armies at Gurdwara Sangat Sahib. When Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji was journeying towards Sri Lanka, Guru Ji stayed here before arriving in Bidar (now known for Sri Nanak Jhira Sahib). Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji also spoke words here regarding the future: that a great treasure lies hidden at Maal Tekri Sahib, and when the Khalsa reaches a number of 96 crore, then with this wealth an unbroken, continuous langar will be served for the Khalsa.

Gurdwara Nagina Ghaat Sahib

Gurdwara Nagina Ghaat marks the spot where Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji would hold the evening diwaan. On one occasion, a Gursikh offered a priceless gemstone but caught in ego, kept calculating its worth. The all-knowing Guru cast the gem into the flowing river. The Sikh's heart sank, assuming Guru Ji had not recognised its value. Perceiving his inner state, Guru Ji instructed him to retrieve it. When he lifted a handful of water from the river, he found many precious gemstones in his hands. Ashamed of his attachment and misunderstanding, he begged forgiveness. The original building work was completed through the seva of Raja Gulab Singh Ji Sethi. After flood damage caused the structure to sink, Sant Baba Shisha Singh Ji initiated rebuilding, and the adjacent ghaat (riverbank) and road were completed by Sant Baba Nidhan Singh Ji.

Gurdwara Banda Ghaat Sahib

Gurdwara Banda Ghaat Sahib commemorates the meeting of Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji with Baba Banda Singh Bahadur (born Lachhman Das in Rajouri). While hunting, he killed a doe; the dying fawns shook him into a state of detachment. He then left for the forests and later became a disciple of a saint. When Guru Gobind Singh Ji arrived and sat on his bed, he attempted to use occult powers to overturn it but failed; he then surrendered at Guru Ji's feet and begged for the true path. He received Amrit and was named Baba Gurbakhsh Singh. Soon after, Guru Ji gave him five arrows, 25 Singhs, a Nishan Sahib and a Nagara, and sent him to Punjab to destroy the oppressors.

Gurdwara Sarabloh Bunga Sahib

Gurdwara Sarabloh Bunga Sahib (Chaunni Nihung Singha) stands on the spot where Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji authored Sri Sarabloh Granth Sahib Ji. When Guru Ji arrived in Nanded, Guru Ji received a Sanskrit Poethi about Sarabloh Avtar (the all-iron manifestation of Akaal Purakh) from sages known as the Nau Nandh. This Poethi was originally written by Dusht Daman (the previous form of Guru Gobind Singh Ji), based on what he witnessed in Satyug, including a war between Sarabloh Avtar and demons such as Bheemnaad and Beerajnaad. Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji then rewrote this Granth into several languages used at the time, including Arabic, Persian, Braj Bhasha, Sanskrit, and Sadhu Bhasha. It also contains praise of the Khalsa, the Chaali Mukte, and the Chaar Sahibzaade.

Takhat Sachkhand Sri Hazur Sahib

The site of Takhat Sachkhand Sri Hazur Sahib marks three key events: the Tap Asthaan (meditation site) associated with Dusht Daman, the Gurgaddi Asthaan of Sri Guru Granth Sahib Ji, and the Sachkhand Gaman Asthaan of Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji. Shortly after arriving at Nanded, Guru Ji shot an arrow from Nagina Ghaat Sahib to the area where Hazur Sahib now stands. Guru Ji instructed the inhabitants who lived there to dig, and they would find remnants connected to Guru Ji from Satyug. In preparation for the Gurgaddi of Sri Guru Granth Sahib Ji, Sri Akhand Paath Sahib was performed, which Guru Ji listened to in its entirety while standing. The Nishaan Sahib on the ground level marks the spot where Sri Guru Granth Sahib Ji was enthroned as the everlasting Guru, alongside five Singhs standing on taabia: Bhai Gurbaksh Singh Ji, Baba Deep Singh Ji, Bhai Dharam Singh Ji, Bhai Santokh Singh Ji, and Bhai Har Singh Ji - representing the Guru Khalsa Panth.

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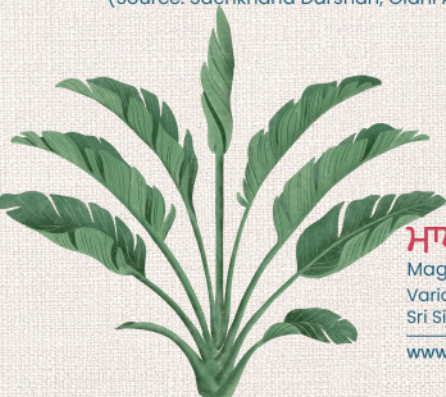

Sri Singhasan Sahib

The inner chamber of Takhat Sahib, where only the Jathedar Sahib (head Pujari) may enter and perform seva, is known as the Singhasan Sahib (throne). It was here that the Angitha (funeral pyre) of Guru Ji was prepared, and Guru Ji rode into the Kanaat (screened enclosure) on horseback. The Gursikhs standing outside saw flames arise, but when the pyre was searched the next day, there was no sign of any bones. Guru Ji thus revealed that they are beyond the confines of the human body and ever "Hazur" (present). From that day onwards, Bhai Santokh Singh Ji created a platform and placed Guru Ji's Shastar upon it. This became known as the Singhasan Sahib, which has been served by a lineage of great Saints. Currently the daily seva of cleaning and placing Guru Ji's Shastar upon the Singhasan Sahib is performed by Singh Sahib Baba Kulwant Singh Ji.

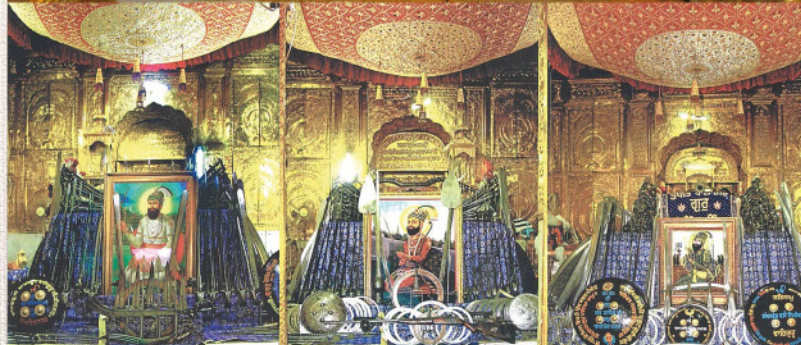

Shastar Darshan Sri Hazur Sahib

Four historic Shastar are shown daily to the Sangat after Sri Rehras Sahib. Firstly, the Tegha (broadsword) of Akali Baba Phula Singh Ji is shown, followed by two Golia Tulwars of Maharaja Ranjit Singh Ji, who played a pivotal role in establishing the structure of Takhat Sachkhand Sri Hazur Sahib. Next, the Khapra Teer of Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji is shown, this arrow is said to have been used to manifest the site of Sri Hazur Sahib, shot from Nagina Ghaat Sahib. Finally, the Kardh of Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji, worn in Guru Sahib's dastaar, is displayed; this was the only remnant recovered from the funeral pyre at the spot where Singhasan Sahib now stands. Countless other priceless Shastar are housed inside the Singhasan Sahib area, including the Ashtbhuja (eight-armed shastar), representing the shakti of Akaal Purakh.

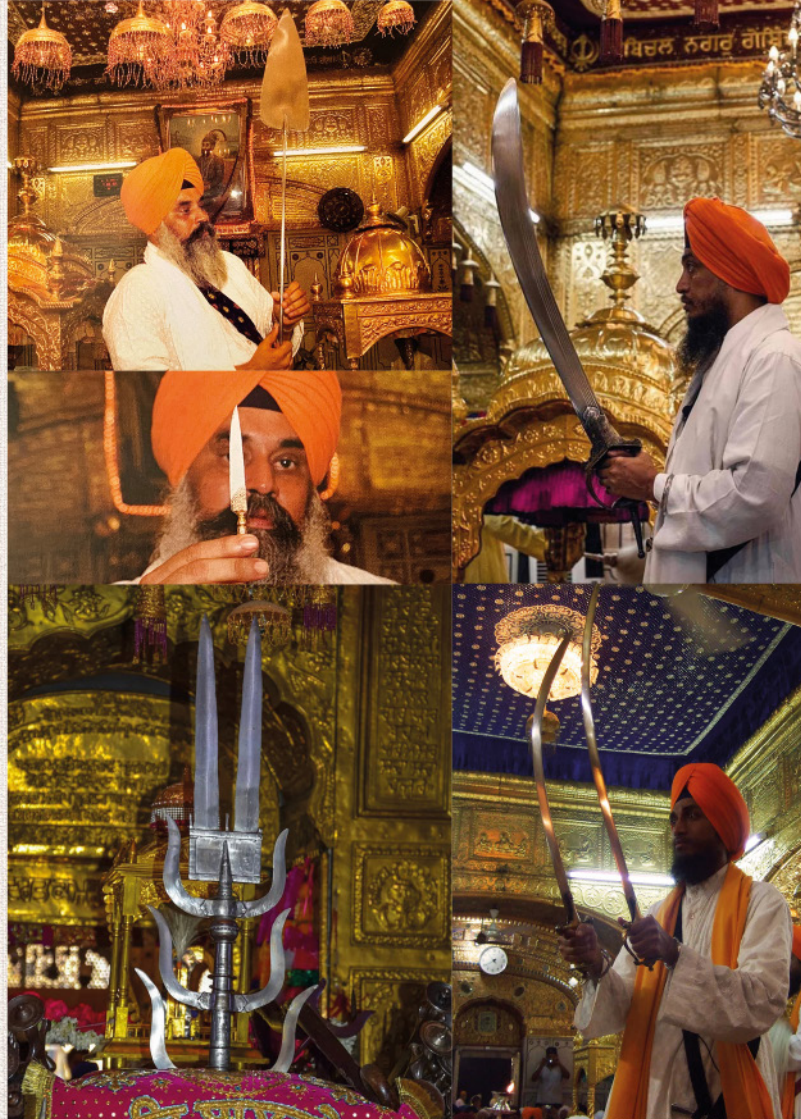

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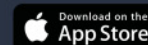
