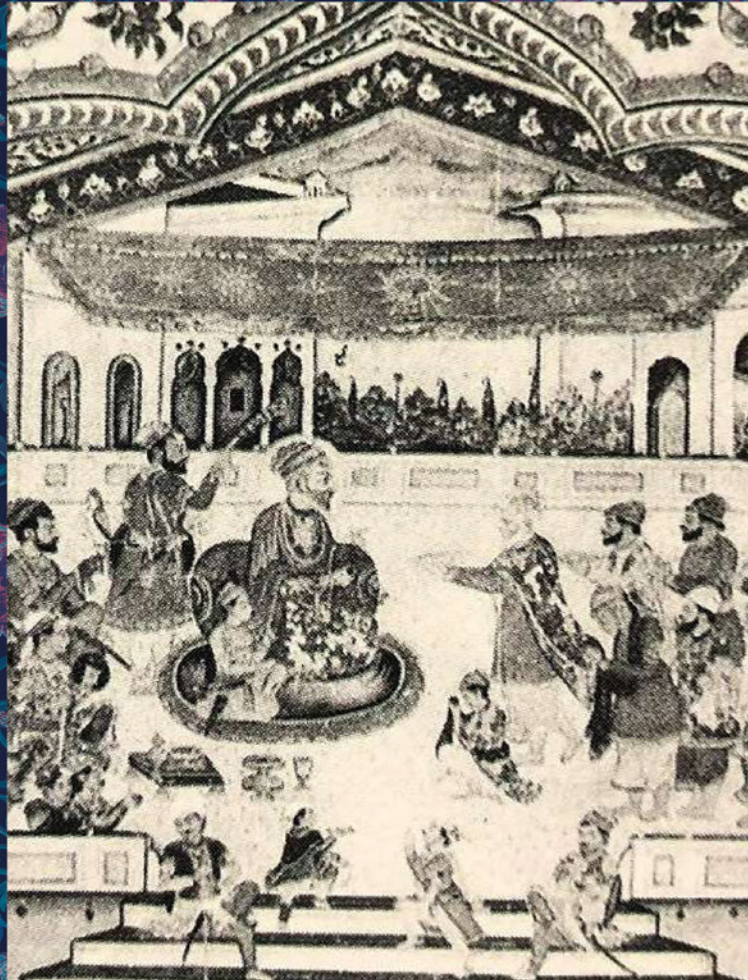

## *Guru Ji's Journey from Anandpur to Delhi*

Aurangzeb sent messengers from Delhi to bring Guru Sahib. However, Guru Ji said they would come to Delhi in their own accord. Guru Ji visited and elated many beloved Sikhs on the way to Delhi, the first was a devoted Muslim disciple of Saifabad (now Bahadurgarh, Patiala area) named Saifdeen. He had the thirst for Guru Ji's Darshan but had not been able to visit Anandpur Sahib. Guru Ji, the inner knower of hearts, fulfilled his wish and stayed in Saifabad for the rainy season (around four months). Further on Guru Ji went to Samana, Karhali, Jind and finally towards Agra.

## *Guru Ji causes their own arrest in Agra*

When Guru Ji arrived in Agra, they encountered a shepherd in a garden and sent him to buy sweets using a valuable ring and shawl as mortgage. However, the shopkeeper suspected theft and turned him over to the police. When questioned, the shepherd revealed Guru Ji had given him the items. Guards were sent to verify this, and upon learning of Guru Ji's presence, authorities surrounded the garden with 400 horsemen. Guru Ji was taken to Agra, where a messenger was sent to Aurangzeb, who, fearing retaliation, dispatched 12,000 horsemen. Guru Ji was later imprisoned in a haunted mansion, where a ghost, sought liberation. Through Guru Ji's grace, the ghost attained salvation.

## *Discussions with Aurangzeb*

Guru Tegh Bahadur Sahib Ji embodied peace and unwavering faith. Upon Guru Ji's arrival in Delhi, Aurangzeb declared his plan to convert the population to Islam, offering wealth and power to those who accepted. Guru Ji reminded him that Vaheguru creates and sustains all, beyond human control. To demonstrate this, Guru Ji instructed Aurangzeb to burn five Mann (185 kg) of black pepper for 24 hours and then sift the remains. Three seeds remained unburnt, symbolizing that instead of one or two, three religions would exist—the third being the Khalsa Panth. Guru Ji explained that faith cannot be forced and that Vaheguru protects those who remain steadfast. Guru Ji said those who abandon their faith will be uprooted, while the devoted will attain spiritual elevation. Guru Tegh Bahadur Sahib Ji was confined in the Kotwali (jail) of Chandni Chowk.

## *Shaheedi of Gursikhs*

Bhai Mati Das, Bhai Sati Das, and Bhai Dayala Ji were devoted Sikhs of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Sahib Ji. Refusing to abandon their faith, they endured brutal executions at the hands of Aurangzeb's regime. Bhai Mati Das was sawed in half alive, unwaveringly reciting Jap Ji Sahib, which continued from both halves of his body until completion. Bhai Dayala Ji was boiled alive in a cauldron of hot water, yet he remained deeply immersed in meditation on Vaheguru. Bhai Sati Das was wrapped in cotton and burned alive; his faith unshaken. Their shaheedi remains an enduring symbol of courage, devotion, and unwavering commitment to their Guru, inspiring generations to stand resolute in the face of oppression.

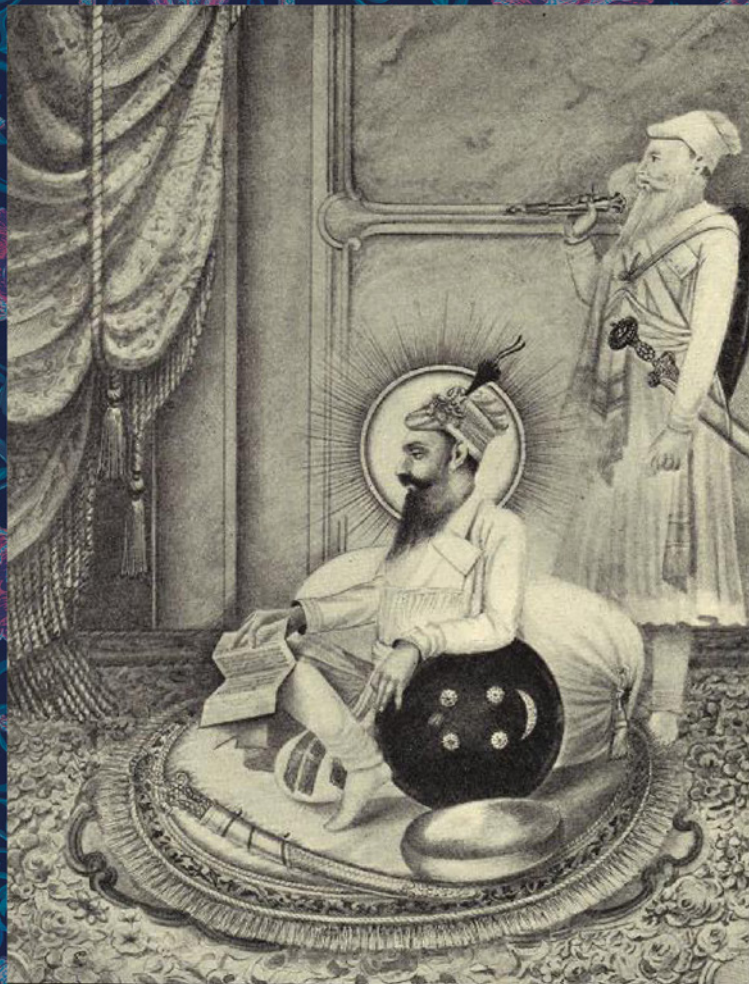


## *Guru Ji's Letters to Anandpur*

Despite numerous meetings with Aurangzeb, the egotistical emperor remained steadfast in his oppressive ways. From the Kotwali (jail) of Chandni Chowk, Guru Ji composed and sent Salok Mahalla 9 in the form of letters to reassure the Sikhs of Anandpur. Some of these verses were specifically addressed to Mata Nanaki Ji (Guru Ji's mother) and Mata Gujri Ji (Guru Ji's wife). As a test of his spiritual strength, Guru Ji sent the Salok "Bal Chutkio Bandhan Pare" to the young Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji, who responded with "Bal Hoa Bandhan Chutte", demonstrating his profound wisdom. Reading this reply, Guru Tegh Bahadur Sahib Ji was pleased and resolved to pass on the Gurgaddi to Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji, recognizing his readiness to lead the Panth.

## *Gurgadhi Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji*

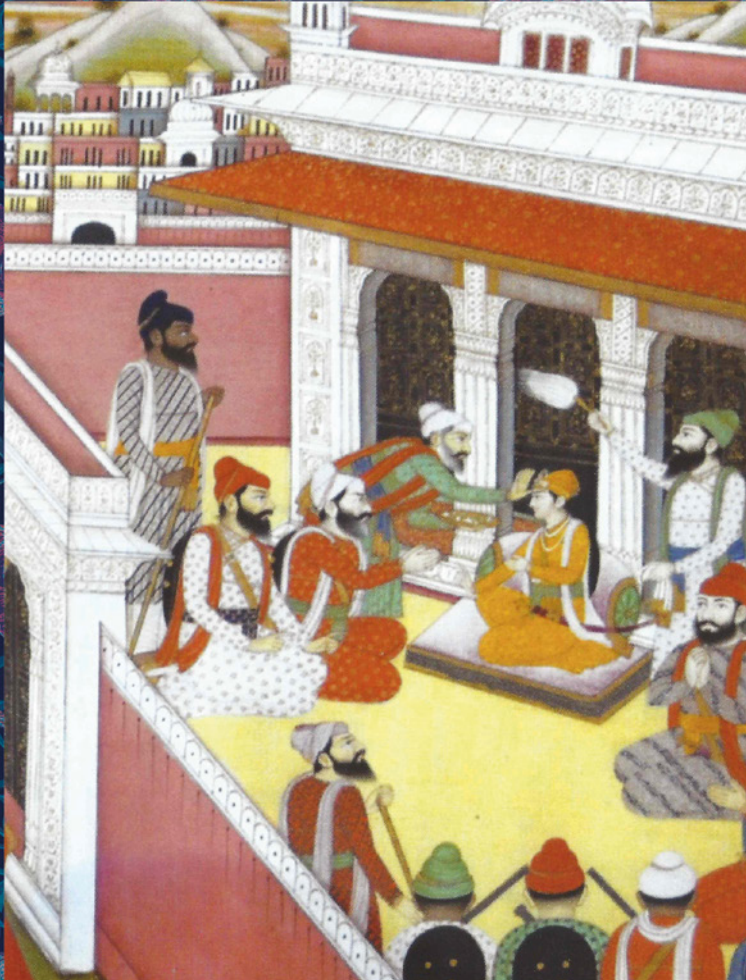
From Delhi, Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji sent Bhai Gurditta Ji (a descendant of Baba Budha Ji) with the regalia to anoint Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji as the next Guru. Bhai Gurditta Ji entrusted the responsibility of performing the Gurgadhi ceremony to his son, Bhai Raam Koer Ji, who was only three years old at the time. Guru Gobind Singh Ji writes about the Shaheedi of Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji in his autobiographical composition titled 'Bachittar Natak':

*'Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji left for Sachkhand, breaking their earthly vase (i.e. their body) on the head of Aurangzeb. No one has ever done such a unique deed like the sacrifice of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji'.*

## *Shaheedi Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji*

After Guru Ji refused to perform miracles or convert to Islam, Aurangzeb ordered their execution. First, the faithful Sikhs of the Guru, Bhai Mati Das Ji, Bhai Sati Das Ji and Bhai Dayal Das Ji accepted Shaheedi, refusing to bow down to the oppression of the Mughal regime. When Aurangzeb asked the meaning of Guru Ji's name, Guru Sahib replied that he would find out at the time of the beheading. Guru Sahib was the master of the sword, the controller of birth and death, no sword could destroy Guru Sahib. In historical sources such as Sri Gurpartap Suraj Granth, it is written that Guru Sahib Ji's head left their body just before the sword of the executioner could touch Guru Sahib Ji's Pavithar Sees. Guru Ji gave Shaheedi on Maghar Sudi 5, 1732 Bikrami, after taking Ishnaan and reciting Sri Jap Ji Sahib.

## Bhai Jaita Ji

After Guru Ji's Shaheedi, there was a great storm and gusts of wind on all sides. As written in historical accounts, a dedicated Sikh of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, Bhai Jaita Ji, was present at the time of Guru Ji's Shaheedi. The blessed head of Guru Ji fell into his lap, and he risked his life travelling with Guru Ji's head all the way to Anandpur Sahib. Accompanied discreetly by Bhai Uda Ji and Bhai Nanu Ji, he avoided major roads, taking five days and stopping at five locations. At Taraori, Bhai Deva Ram Ji, a devout Sikh, sheltered Guru Ji's sacred head overnight. In Ambala, Bhai Jaita Ji hid by a Jand tree before seeking refuge with Bhai Ram Deva Ji. Passing through Banur and Nabha, he received assistance from a Muslim Pir. Singing Gurbani throughout the journey, Bhai Jaita Ji finally reached Kiratpur Sahib, where he reverently handed over Guru Sahib's head to Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji.

## *Sis Ganj Sahib & Rakab Ganj Sahib*

Gurdwara Sri Sis Ganj Sahib stands on the spot where Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Sahib Ji gave the ultimate sacrifice for the protection of Dharam (righteousness). The brave Bhai Lakhi Shah Vanjara risked his life to retrieve Guru Ji's Sareer (body) from Chandi Chowk. Placing Guru Ji's Sareer in his house for cremation, he set his home alight to avoid the detection of the Mughal forces. On this spot now stands Gurdwara Sri Rakab Ganj Sahib (Delhi).

## *Sis Ganj Sahib (Anandpur Sahib)*

After placing Guru Ji's sacred head in a palanquin, Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji embraced Bhai Jaita Ji and honoured him with the words "**Ranghreta Guru Ka Beta**" (the Ranghreta is the Guru's son). The site where Bhai Jaita Ji handed over the sacred head is now marked by Gurdwara Bibangarh Sahib. From Kiratpur Sahib, the Guru's family and devotees solemnly marched to Anandpur Sahib, singing Gurbani. Upon arrival, Guru Ji constructed a platform near Guru Ke Mahal and reverently cremated Guru Tegh Bahadur Sahib Ji's head, while the Sangat recited Gurbani. Gurdwara Sri Sis Ganj Sahib (Anandpur) stands on this spot. Bhai Jaitha Ji was renamed Bhai Jivan Singh Ji during the Amrit Sanchaar and attained Shaheedi fighting tyrants after the siege of Sri Anandpur Sahib.

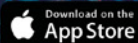
